

HASKAP - *Lonicera caerulea*

| TUNDRA | Commercial growers | 1.49 grams | 1.5-2.0m (4-6 feet) | Long flat bullet shape; sweet tangy taste; dry scar | Mid-late June |
| BOREALIS | U-pick or home gardeners | 1.62 grams | 1.5-2.0 m | Short, flat, boxy shape; sweet tart taste; wet scar | Mid-late June |
| INDIGO YUM (aka 9-92) | Commercial growers, similar to Tundra | 1.29 grams | 1.5-2.0 m | Long flat oval shape; sweet tangy taste; dry scar | Mid-late June |
| INDIGO GEM (aka 9-15) | Processed products | 1.30 grams | 1.5-2.0 m | Short oval shape; sweet tart tasty; chewy; dry scar | Mid-late June |
| HONEY BEE *NEW* | U of S pollinator option; could be a companion variety when hand-picked | Not available | 1.75-2.25m | More tart than other U of S varieties, but less tart than most Russian pollinators; Stems often remain on fruit when picked | Mid-late June |
| Berry Blue™ | Russian variety pollinator option | Smaller than U of S varieties | 1.75-2.25m | Tube shape; not as sweet as U of S varieties; | Mid-late June |

Important notes: Haskap is recommended hardy to zone 2. The plants flower from April to May and are pollinated by insects. Flowers can withstand freezing temperatures to -7 C. Requires cross-pollination – recommended 1 pollinator plant per 5 to 10 plants. Haskap prefers moist soil and will grow in light (sandy), medium (loamy) and heavy (clay) soils. It can also adapt to acid, neutral and basic (alkaline) soil conditions. A sunny to part-sunny location is best.
