*Lonicera caerulea* L.

It is hardy to zone 2. It is in flower from April to May. Flowers are pollinated by Insects. Requires a pollinator – recommended 1 pollinator per 5 to 10 plants. The plant will grow in light (sandy), medium (loamy) and heavy (clay) soils. The plant grows in acid, neutral and basic (alkaline) soils. A sunny to part-sunny location is best i.e. no shade. It prefers moist soil. Flowers can withstand freezing temperatures to -7 C.
